We will be trialling some of the activities in school this term with a view to embedding this in our practice next session.

School Building updates

I've received some concerns from parents/carers about the <u>Gate Post/pillar</u> at the main gate on Broomhill Road. After some investigation I've discovered that the pillar was allegedly hit by a reversing vehicle some time ago and is now a bit squint! Just to reassure everyone, the pillar has been assessed by our Architects at Aberdeen City Council and has been deemed safe. I have however spoken with them to look at correcting the pillar and restoring this as soon as possible—I'll keep you posted! (pardon the pun)

Our <u>window replacement programme</u> will continue this term and you will begin to see evidence of this when the scaffolding appears around the 19th of June, in preparation for the bulk of the work to be completed over the summer period. This programme of work is due to continue throughout the summer holiday period and possibly into the beginning of next term. This will mean that some classes on the top floor may have to vacate their rooms for a couple of days towards the end of term but we are confident that this will not impact negatively on learning and teaching in school.

Pupil Equity Funding Update

Scottish Government has allocated funding to schools to help close the poverty related gap in attainment. Broomhill School has been allocated the sum of £19,000. This funding will seek to deliver improvements to the educational attainment and will specifically target reducing the impact that poverty has on educational outcomes. Accompanying this letter is an information sheet from Education Scotland giving more details about PEF.


Our PEF funding has been allocated based on the numbers of children and young people from P1- P7 receiving Free School Meals.
