### Meet the Teacher—Open Afternoon

We would like to invite you to attend an Open Afternoon on **Wednesday 20th September**. This will provide an opportunity for you to see your child's class in action and meet their teacher. Following your visit why not pop in to the Dining Room for a quick cuppie in aid of **Macmillan**.

To allow for the large numbers of possible visitors, timings for the afternoon will be as follows:

1.30pm—2pm: Visits to P1, P2 and P3 (Rm 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12)

2pm—2.30pm: Visits to P4 and P5 (Rm 18, 19, 15 and 16)

2.30pm—3pm: Visits to P6 and P7 (Rm 20, 21, 22 and 13)

This will be a normal working day for pupils and staff therefore staff will not be able to talk to you individually about your child's progress, this is an opportunity to see the class in action learning, and "put a face" to your child's new teacher. Children will also be asked to remain in class during this time and won't be permitted to move around the school with you.

Don't forget to pop in for a tea/coffee after your visit to class.

Nursery will be organising separate Stay and Play sessions later in the term once all of our new pupils are settled in.

#### Broomhill School – Daily Mile

Research links movement with developing cognitive skills and raised attainment



- · Children go out in almost all weathers (playground/woodies)
- At a time of the teacher's choosing
- Fifteen minute turnaround maximum
- Children don't need to change
- Each class should plan their own strategy for the Daily Mile and track their own performance, eg. Beads/counters in jar per lap, tally chart etc.
- The measurement and targets vary and are suggested by the children and the class teacher
- Often there is no specific measurement

#### Anticipated Impact

- The Daily Mile is inclusive of all children
- Improved focus

- Children thrive on being outdoors experiencing the fresh air, the weather, the sights and the sounds
- Improved fitness of all children in the school
- Improved fitness leading to children getting more out of their PE sessions
- Improved peer relationships
- Children feeling positive about fitness

On a Health and Safety note, can I ask that all parents/carers bringing their children to and from the Out of School Clubs both before and after school do so through the playground and not through the car park at the rear of the school as agreed with the Club. Our School Health and Safety Policy states that children are not permitted in the car park. This is a very small area where vans/lorries access the school for deliveries etc and is therefore an unsafe area for pupils. There is no available parking for drop off/ collection in this area. Parents/carers are respectfully asked to park in the street and access the Out of School Club via the school gate, walking round the playground to the back door of the dining room, the designated entrance/exit to the club. Your support with this is much appreciated.

## Health/medication matters

If your child receives regular medication and requires this to be administered in school, you may have received a letter recently asking for updated information. Please return this to school as soon as possible so that we can ensure that we have the correct medication/care plan in place to support your child.

We currently have an increasing number of pupils who have allergies to nuts and as such we would like to discourage parents/carers from sending their children to school with snacks containing nuts, helping us to minimise the risk of anaphylaxis and other severe reactions. Thank you.

# <u>School Uniform</u>

We are very pleased to see that almost all of our pupils are wearing school uniform as set out in our guidelines within our School Handbook. We strongly encourage the wearing of our uniform, which is still the most economical way of clothing children to come to school. School sweatshirts, cardigans etc can be purchased



through our school office after completion of a Uniform Order Form. Mrs Turner will process uniform orders during her working days of Monday – Wednesday. Parents/ carers are asked where possible to make their uniform requests on a Monday, so that Mrs Turner can process the order during her working days.

Please remember to clearly name all items of uniform and equipment, if your child comes home with the wrong jumper etc, please remember to return it to the lost property area on the ground floor in the infant hall.

Our PTA is now operating a second hand uniform scheme and donations are always welcome. Please see Mrs Laura Angus for more information.

A reminder that pupils in P1-3 receive free school meals and pupils in P4-7 should pay for their tickets in advance of lunchtime.
