#### Uniform Re-use and Recycle

As part of our ongoing work in ensuring that we are being a more eco-friendly school we are introducing a Uniform Reuse and Recycle Scheme. Any items of uniform in good condition can be handed into school to be made available to other families to reuse. One of our parents, Mrs Laura Angus, has very kindly agreed to run this scheme and will be available on the 1st Friday of each month at the beginning and end of the day in the Infant Hall( 9am—9.30am) and 2.40pm—3.10pm) to help anyone wishing to recycle or re-use items of uniform.

Although we try and keep the costs of our uniform to a minimum, we understand that the cost of the school day and equipping our pupils can mount up. We hope that by introducing this scheme it will help all our pupils to be able to wear the Broomhill uniform that we are so proud of.

#### School Improvement Priorities 2017-18

Our Annual Standards and Quality Report and Improvement Plan is currently with ACC for approval. This document details the current context for Broomhill School and our progress with our current improvement plans.

Our School Improvement Priorities for this session are as follows:

- Develop a Curriculum Rationale and High Level Curriculum Map for Broomhill School.
- 2. Raise attainment in literacy with a specific focus on writing and phonological development
- 3. Develop effective practice in Planning for Learning, Assessment and Moderation with a particular focus on AiFL strategies. (Assessment is for Learning)
- 4. Improve our understanding of the mental health needs within our school and support pupils wellbeing appropriately.

The full report and further detail of these priorities will be on display during Parents Evening in November and we would encourage you to look at this and provide comments and feedback to help us take these improvements forward.

### **Literacy Developments**

A message from Miss McCartney (DHT) about our new literacy processes.



Last year all staff worked hard to create a literacy programme and phonics progression suitable for the pupils at Broomhill School. The programme that has been created ensures progression, challenge and support for pupils across the school.

This year, all pupils have completed individual assessments to identify areas of development and to ensure appropriate challenge.

Assessments identified the common words individual pupils were finding difficult to spell. Every child now has their own common words which they will learn at home and in school at a level suitable for them. The class teacher assesses these every fortnight and pupils move on to the next set of words when they have full marks in this assessment. Please encourage your child to practise these regularly at home.

Pupils' knowledge of sounds (phonemes) were also assessed and pupil groups were established from this assessment. Each week pupils will learn a new sound and this will be tested weekly to ensure understanding of the sound.

Pupils have also completed a reading assessment which has identified the book band colour that pupils will begin on and the comprehension skills which they need to develop. We are using the reflective reading approach which develops comprehension and reading skills in an engaging way, also making use of Higher Order Thinking strategies. Pupils are challenged by the questions which are set and this links to the class or group reading book.

There will be an information evening next term to share our Literacy developments and approaches with you further next term but in the meantime we hope this information helps you in assisting your child to continue to develop their literacy skills.

#### **Parents Evenings**

During this school year there will be two opportunities for you to meet individually with your child's class teacher. This first opportunity is now approaching in November and hopefully you have all handed in the slips to indicate your preferred appointment time on either; Tuesday 7th November (6pm—8.30pm) or Wednesday 8th November (3.30pm—6pm).

If you have forgotten to send the slip back, don't worry, just contact your child's teacher after the holidays and we will arrange an appointment for you then.

Appointment times will be sent home with your children on Monday 30th October.

It's been great to see everyone returning to Nursery this term and we are so delighted to welcome our new children into both nursery rooms, everyone is settling in really well and we've been so busy already. Keep checking our school blog to see what we've been up to.

### Snack

The pupils in nursery very much enjoy discussing and devising the snack menu each week. Staff help to support the children in making healthy choices in order that all snacks meet the guidance in "Setting the table" (Nutritional Guidance and Food Standards for Early Years Child care providers in Scotland).

Please note that Snack Payments in Nursery are £2.50 per week. This amount is payable regardless of your child being present or absent in nursery. Adjustments to the amount are made during weeks where there are school holidays/in service days.

From the start of the new term, we will only be accepting snack payments on a Monday. This is to help us with banking arrangements. Snack payments can be paid weekly or in full for the term. Next term is an 8 week term with one In Service Day so snack payment will be £19.50 for the term.


#### <u>Trips</u>
