Act out a scene from your favourite book. Turn the story into a script.	Create a new game-remember to include detail of how to play, and how to win!	Help make a meal, or bake, for the whole family. What ingredients do you need, in what quantities, make a menu, how much could you charge in a restaurant?	Take a toy on an adventure around your house or garden. Draw a picture of the adventure or write a story about it. Be a journalist and interview your toy.	Download Scratch Jr (app) and learn the basics of coding.
Google Earth- find where you live, explore other places. Make a map. Find out how many shoe shops there are on a certain street.	Make a Lego maze for your toys (or your hamster!).	Write your own book, or movie script.	Put some dirty pennies in vinegar and see what happens!	Make a slow-motion video of something in nature. Find out about it.
