Our In-School team have worked exceptionally hard this week supporting our learners and despite the huge challenge of supporting pupils from different stages and different classes all completing different tasks, are doing an amazing job. Thank you!

It's been a challenging couple of weeks for many of our staff members as they also juggle home and school support and as always, I'm exceptionally proud of their efforts. Our staff continue to develop their digital skills and learn new ways of delivering learning online every day.
